ULAP: Overview

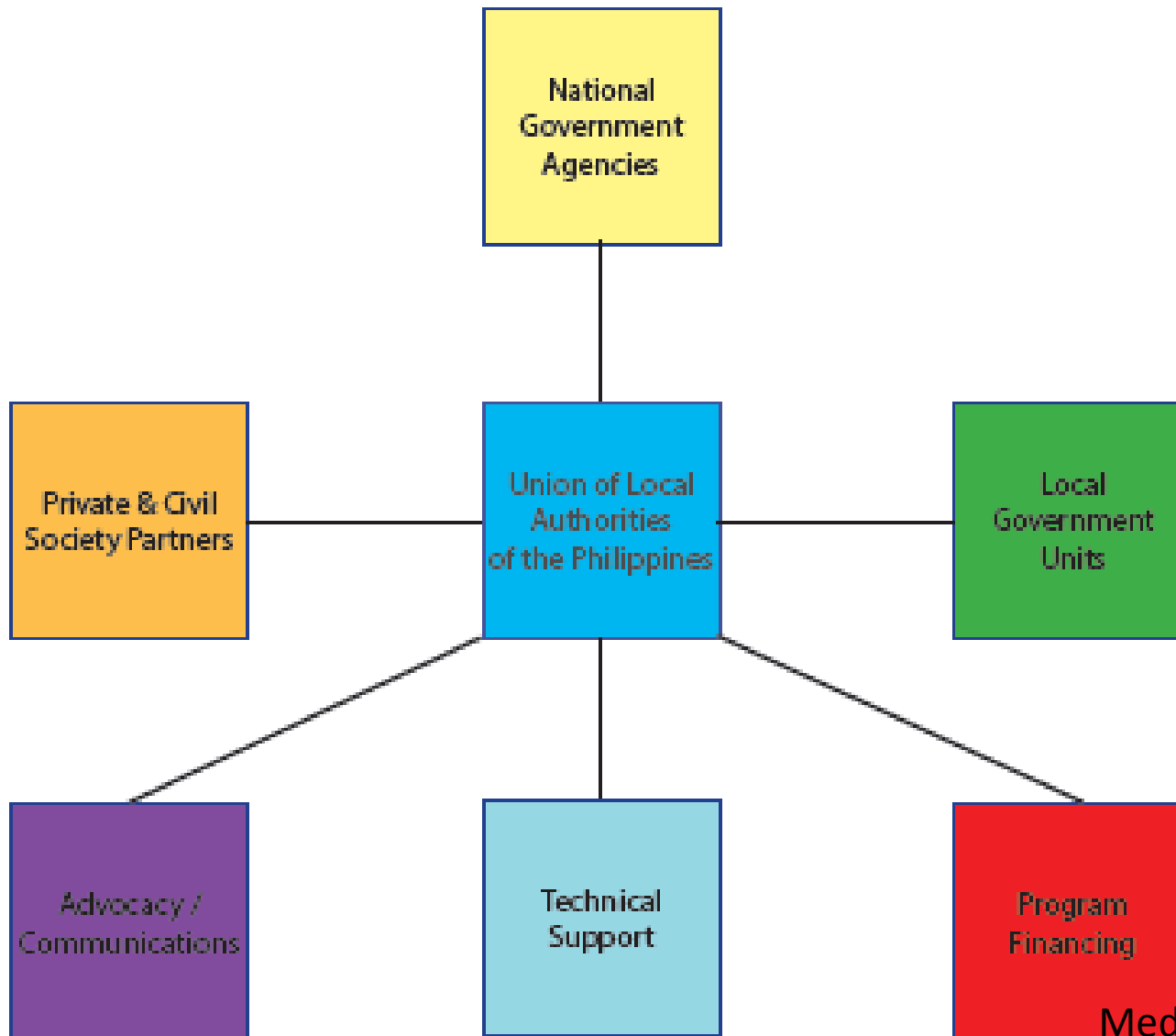
- Formed in 1998; registered in 1999; endorsed through EO 351 (2004)
- Prior to formation, ULAP was called “League of Leagues” and instrumental in convening LGUs for the 1991 Local Government Code



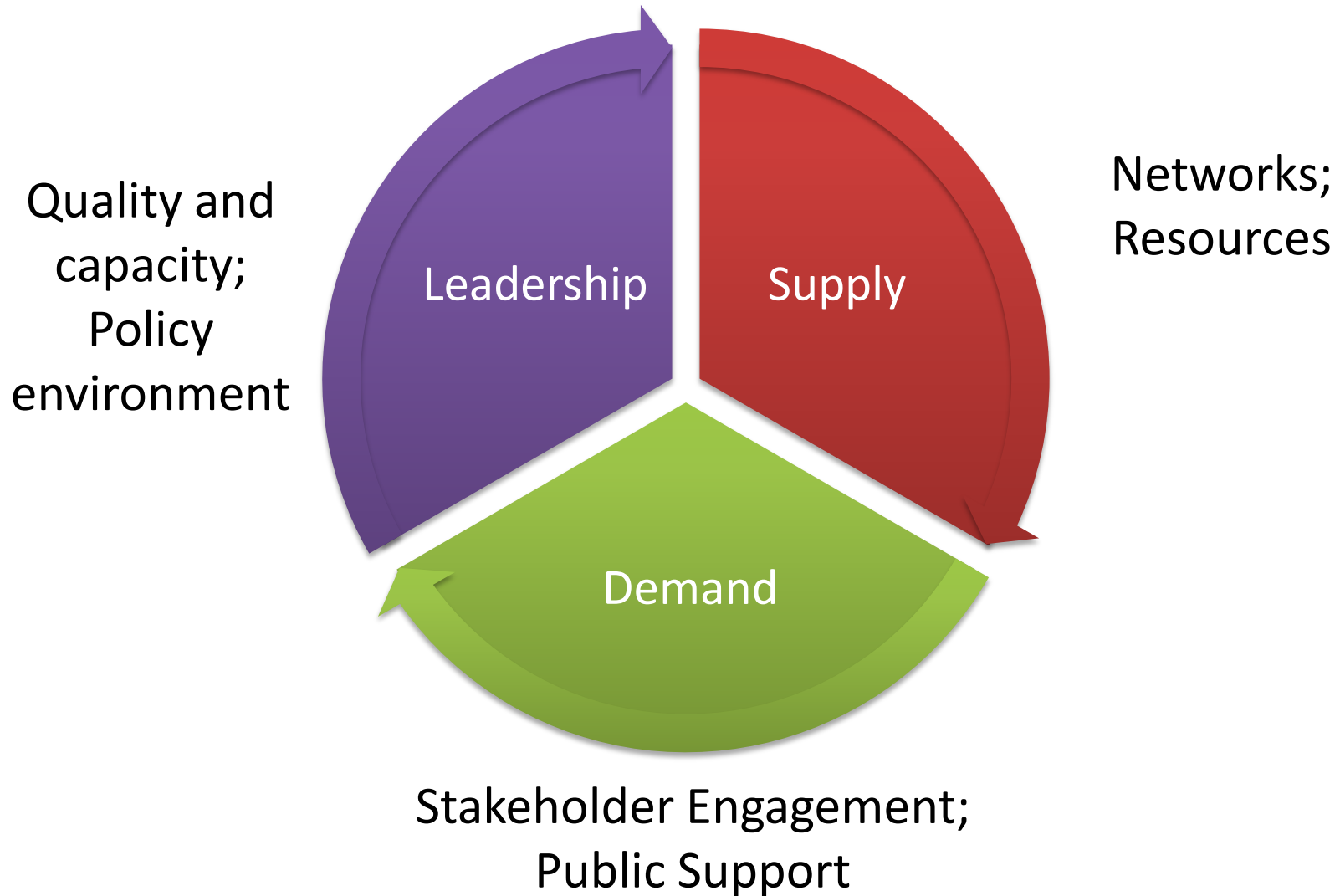


